This course is designed to develop the ability of students' to understand and use spoken English. Students will learn a wide range of useful vocabulary relating to a variety of common 'real world' situations, practice listening comprehension skills for spoken English of a spectrum of degrees of formality and topics, and learn to express themselves effectively in spoken English. These skills will be taught in an integrated manner with the overall aim of enhancing students' ability to communicate in natural spoken English. Each class will have a particular theme, with students learning important vocabulary and expressions relating to this theme. Dialogues and exercises will be used to teach vocabulary in context and to provide listening comprehension practice. Students will be encouraged to develop their own ideas relating to the theme, express them to the class and discuss them in smaller groups. Role playing exercises will also be used to allow students to practice spoken English in a variety of common real-world settings.

Assessment will be based on class participation, performance in the mid-semester and final examinations, and two vocabulary

quizzes. Examinations will contain a strong aural and oral component.
