It aims to consolidate and enhance the reading skills acquired in the first semester English Reading Course. It centers on the development of communicative ability in reading and with a focus on extending inner capacity through the study of texts on topics and exercises on a variety of life related context. Listening, speaking and writing skills will also be advanced. The critical analysis of works selected from across the disciplines is also emphasized. Students will develop a strategic approach to efficient reading and active learning. And use the linguistic and cultural content and skills learnt to understand, communicate and manage in real-life situations.
TEACHING APPROACH	Lecture, pair-work, role-play, group discussions, peer editing activities, in-class discussion of assignments, literature circles, and various fun activities.
