COURSE OBJECTIVES	 Students will gain advanced skills and knowledge of academic writing in English. This is a first year English Writing course. The emphasis is to consolidate and enhance the important aspects of writing process acquired in the first semester such as idea development/organizing skills, paragraphs writing, English grammar, editing skills and critical thinking. It aims to deepen and strengthen students' short essay writing skills on a variety of topics or themes about daily life in modern Taiwan. It also provides students with the opportunity to build on reading skills and language they are developing through communicative exercises. Assessment is based on weekly exercises, written tests, assignments and class participation.
